We held more Speakers Bureau events than at any time since the program began. Think and Drink attendance was the highest it's ever been. SPEAKERS BUREAU draws from a pool of leading cultural experts and scholars to provide free conversational lecture events for community partners to offer local audiences throughout the state.






